ORDINANCE NO. 2010-0- 05
AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING
PARKING ACROSS
SIDEWALKS

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees of the Village of Tolono, "Village" is charged with the health, care and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The Village has considered the needs of pedestrians to be able to utilize public sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, There has been concern about vehicles being parked across sidewalks preventing pedestrians from utilizing the sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, The Board has deemed it necessary and appropriate to prohibit parking across public sidewalks.

NOW, THEREFORE be it hereby ordained as follows:

Title 10 "Vehicles and Traffic" of the Village of Tolono Revised Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to additionally include the following provision:

"10.29 Sidewalk Parking. The parking of motor vehicles on or across public sidewalks, even in part, is hereby prohibited. Each day that such a violation continues shall be deemed a separate violation. In the event of a violation of this provision, the violator shall be fined an amount of \$25.00 for the First Offense. In the event of a Second Offense, (being a violation which occurs within 6 months of the First Offense) the violator shall be fined an amount of \$75.00. In the event of subsequent offenses (being offenses which occur after the Second Offense but within 6 months of the first offense) the violator shall be fined an amount of \$150.00 for each subsequent offense."

To the extent that any provision of the within Ordinance conflicts with a provision of the Tolono Revised Code of Ordinances, the within Ordinance shall prevail. All other terms of the Tolono Revised Code of Ordinances shall remain in full force and effect.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption and the Village Clerk is directed to publish it in pamphlet form in accordance with applicable law.
